

Phonics 5 Lesson Plan

WEEK FIVE

Day 1

P. 19: The "GN" sound: After doing the page, look up the definitions of the following words: consignment, cologne, feigned, sovereign. Read Mt. 8:12: "Where there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth?"

Day 2

P. 20: Circle the words with wr. Pronounce these words and practice writing them. Do you have an Advent Wreath?

Write the following words on the board or on a piece of paper; pronounce the words; if time, write sentences: reign, wrists, wrote, foreign, wrong, myrrh. For example: When King David reigned over Israel, he had many foreign countries in his kingdom. The soldiers tied Jesus' wrists to the pillar and scourged him. The Three Wise Men gave Jesus gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Day 3

P. 21: The three sounds of ear. Mt. 13:46: Read about the "pearl of great price" What sound (ear, air, or ur) do the words in quotes have: Joseph and Mary settled in a town "near" Cana called Nazareth. Moses went closer to the burning bush, and "heard" his name called by the voice of God. Joseph and Mary "searched" three days for Jesus and found Him in the temple. King Saul attempted to kill David with a "spear" but David fled. The soldiers gave Jesus a purple robe to "wear".

P. 22: Have fun. P. 23: One sound but two spellings! Just a care of memorizing! What is the meaning of pare? Correction: For Part 3, No. 4: bears, bear

Day 4

You already have had <u>ai</u> and <u>ay</u> stand for the long <u>a</u> sound. On P. 37, you learn that <u>ei</u> and <u>ey</u> stand for the long <u>a</u> sound. You simply must memorize the spelling of these words. Which word has the long <u>a</u> sound: Mt. 8:27: "The winds and the sea obey Him." In the spaces on p. 37, write the words from the sentences.

Day 5

P. 38 and P. 39: This is a tough one: The <u>ea</u> letters can have three different sounds. You simply must memorize the spelling of these words. There are not too many of them, however.

Find the vowel digraph words: Jacob deceived his father Isaac, and took the blessing that was meant for his brother Esau. The soldiers cast lots for the cloak worn by Jesus on the way to Calvary. The cock crowed three times after Peter denied that he knew Jesus. Judas was filled with woe after he betrayed Jesus, so he went out and hung himself.
