


## He Is Risen!

### Happy Easter from the Counseling Department

Every year at the Easter Vigil, our parish priest reads the Paschal Homily of St. John Chrysostom, and every year it brings tears to my eyes, for in that homily we are reminded

that those who have died are not gone, that in truth, they will rise again, and that we will be re-united. For those of us who have ever lost a loved one, and that is most of us, Easter is a particularly beautiful and wonderful feast. Though we profess a belief in the resurrection of the dead every time we say the Creed, we see the truth of that claim in the flesh, as it were, every time we celebrate Easter.

Easter is the ultimate triumph of Life over death. By His Resurrection, Christ has freed us from the bonds of sin and the power of Satan. By His Resurrection, Christ has given us all hope of resurrection for ourselves and those we love. He has triumphed for all of us over evil, suffering, pain, and sorrow. Because of



Christ, there is Light at the end of the tunnel. Because of Christ, we can overcome evil and suffering. Because of Christ, death is not permanent nor in any way ultimately triumphant. As St. John Chrysostom puts it,

Christ is risen, and life reigns. Christ is risen, and not one dead remains in the grave. For Christ, being risen from the dead, is become the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep."

Let us rejoice in the Resurrection of Our Lord, and let us give thanks to Him for the lives

of those who have gone before us. To Him be glory unto ages of ages! Amen.
