## Week One

## Day 1

## Day 1

Do Lesson 8: Recognizing short vowels. Read the short vowel rule. Say the words aloud to be sure of your answer.

Do Lesson 9: Review short vowels. Read the sentences aloud.

## Day 3

Do Lesson 10: Recognizing exceptions to short-vowel rule.

Words that end with $\mathbf{s t}, \mathbf{l d}$, and $\mathbf{n d}$ often make the vowel before them have the long-vowel sound. Examples: post, wild, kind. After completing the exercise, think of other words that are exceptions to the short-vowel rule.

## Day 4

Do Review: Lessons 6 to 8.

Circle the short vowel sounds in this sentence: The devil tempted Eve.

## Day 5

Review: Lessons 9 and 10.

Using Bible stories, write a few sentences omitting all of the initial consonant of the words, then fill in the missing consonant and circle any vowels with the short-vowel sound.

Begin with these: God made the Earth in six days and rested on the seventh day. Adam and Eve had two sons, Cain and Abel. God made a covenant with Abraham.

Go back over the above sentences and pick out consonants in the middle of the words.
