Name

The English **alphabet** has twenty-six letters.

Upper Case Letters

ABCDEFGHIJKLMNOPQRSTUVWXYZ

Lower Case Letters

a b c d e f g h i j k l m n o p q r s t u v w x y z

Twenty-one letters are **consonants**.

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Five letters are **vowels**.

a e i o u

Each letter of the alphabet has a **name** and a **sound**.

- When you see the letter b, you call it by its **name**, b.
- When you see the letter *b* in a word, the letter *b* stands for its **sound /b/**, as in ball.

When **consonant sounds** are made, the mouth is partly <u>closed</u>.

When **vowel sounds** are made, the mouth is <u>open</u>.

Phonics is the study of the sounds of letters. When the sounds of letters are joined together, they form words.

*When you see / / around a lowercase letter, that represents the sound of that letter.

Name

The first sound in a word is the beginning sound. Most words begin with a consonant.

Vowel Sounds - Short O

In a one-vowel word, if the vowel does not come at the end of the word, that vowel is usually short.

We hear the short sound of **o** /**ŏ**/ in **hop** and **pot**.

Syllables

Name

Words are made up of groups of letters called syllables. These syllables sound like "beats" in a word. Each syllable has one vowel sound.

Otto Robot pronounes the sounds of letters in a word in a very mechanical way. When you are listening for the vowel sounds in a word, speak like Otto.


