# FIRST QUARTER

# Week One -

#### **PARENT:**

Your child needs to form correct habits of writing letters; incorrect habits are very difficult to change. If your child needs to review proper letter formation or needs additional drill, you may use the Handwriting Practice Sheets available on our website. Log on to your MySeton page, click on Courses, scroll down to Handwriting 4, and click on the yellow notebook icon for viewing resources. #### **PARENT:**

Please look over the text-workbook with your child. Look over the art on both the front and the back cover. Look at the title page. Read the back of the title page. Read the Dedication.

Look over page iv, which shows the letters with the arrows for the strokes, both for the printed manuscript and the cursive.

You can check off work as you complete it!



Read the **table of contents**. Read the **Introduction**. Study the **Correct Writing Position**. Can your child read **"Lessons to Live By"** in cursive?

Your child should do these exercises in the writing tablet as well.



#### Learn the simple terms and strokes:

- The undercurve is from down to up, curving slightly under; overcurve is from down to up, curving slightly over.
- The downcurve and the slant start from the top; the downcurve curves down, and the slant is a straight downward stroke.

Practice the cursive lowercase letters.



Notice the details in the painting of *Christ on the Cross* on p. 5.

# THIRD QUARTER

#### PARENT:

The assignments in the Third Quarter are for improved accuracy and flow. You will notice that the handwriting is smaller. The handwriting lines in the second half of the book are designed to be used with either the previously sized letters or smaller letters. If your child is not ready to write smaller letters, you may allow him to write the letters in the size used in the first half of the book. With time, your child will develop the necessary fine motor coordination to write smaller letters. Your child can refer back to the lessons in the book and in this Course Manual when necessary. It is important to keep practicing and to practice cursive writing in the other subject areas. In addition to the assignments below, you may want to assign more practice in the Handwriting Tablet, as necessary.
