The last painting on p. 3 is known by two titles: <i>The Immaculate Conception with Saints</i> or <i>The Incarnation</i> .

Notice that Jesus bears wounds in His hands and feet, a sign of His Death on the Cross that was our salvation.

Religion 6: Answer the True or False questions.

The painting of Jesus as the Good Shepherd is the result of one of His parables. Jesus reminded us that the Good Shepherd cares about each one of His sheep, and will take the time and trouble to leave the ninety-nine in the flock to look for even one which is lost. This story or parable that Jesus told is a reminder that God cares for each one of us; He does not think that enough have been saved until each one of us is saved. Even if the whole world loves you, it cannot compare with the love that Jesus has for you.

The second painting is of St. Cecilia. The crown of flowers being put on her head represents the crown of martyrdom or sainthood. Cecilia lived from 230 to 250. She was a young Christian who was forced by her father to be married; her husband became Christian and was martyred. Then the Romans imprisoned and killed her. Several hundred years later, her incorrupt body was found. She was proclaimed a saint by the Catholic Church. In the painting, we see Cecilia playing an organ and angels playing several instruments. She is often pictured with musical instruments and is the patron of musicians because she said that, on her wedding day, while there was the playing of secular music, she had music for Jesus in her heart.



Moses, Follower of Ribera

In the painting, Moses shows and explains the Ten Commandments to the people of Israel. God appeared to Moses on Mount Sinai and gave him the Ten Commandments, written on two stone tablets. When Moses came down from the mountain, he found the people committing the grave sin of worshiping a golden calf they had made. At that point, Moses threw the tablets on the ground, where they broke. God later remade the tablets, and Moses here explains the Commandments which were given to all people for all time. Although God puts the Ten Commandments in men's hearts, He also has given mankind the written Ten Commandments. During Old Testament times, the people of Israel had little boxes on their doorposts with the Ten Commandments printed inside.

	The four paintings are about confessing sins and being sorry for our sins. The first painting is of the woman who met Jesus at a well, titled <i>Woman at the Well</i> . She was a sinner, and when Jesus began talking to her about her sins, she realized that He was the promised Messiah. She ran back to the town and told everyone to come out to meet Him.	
	In the second painting, Mary Magdalene expresses deep sorrow for her sins by washing the feet of Jesus with her tears.	
	The third painting shows a story from the Old Testament, in which Joseph's brothers approach him after being forgiven for the sins they committed against him. The brothers had sold their brother Joseph to the Egyptians as a slave, but he rose to be an important counselor to the Egyptian pharaoh.	
	The final painting on p. 237 is another of Jesus with the woman at the well. The message that Jesus gave her was that the water in the well could quench her thirst for only a little while, but He had the water, the water of Baptism, which could give eternal life. In the Gospel of John, Jesus said, "Whoever drinks of this water shall thirst again; but he that shall drink of the water that I will give him shall not thirst forever" (John 4:13).
